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- Make it interesting
- Make it easy on the brain
- Let them read what they love until "launch"
- Don't bore them; keep it fresh
- Stick to the "Special Ed" 3:
  - Small task size
  - Frequency
  - Short duration of sessions

- Easier teaching
- •Easier learning

## Methodology

- •5 minutes twice a day = Reading Prescription
- Fast Flash technique for learning vocabulary
- •Sandwich Style Teaching with *all* materials
- •Analytic Phonics, not Synthetic Phonics
- Brain Design: clarity, large font size, white space

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Let's go down that short list...

1	Tell me about 5 minutes twice a day
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- Select your material
- Gather the related flash cards in groups of 5
- Fast Flash each group (start with only 1 group) 3 times quickly, 1 or 2 cards per second
- Read the book/material
- Fast Flash again
- High five!

Z	Tell me	about	Fast	Flash

- Put flash cards in groups of 5
- Fast Flash each group 3 times quickly
- 1 or 2 cards per second
- Start with only 1 group, add a second or third in time



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Tell me about Analytic Phonics

- Analytic phonics: from the meaningful whole word to its parts
- Synthetic phonics: from the meaningless part to the whole

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Why do you recommend Analytic Phonics?

- Difficulty discriminating sounds
- Poor short term memory
- Poor auditory memory
- Fluctuating hearing loss throughout life
- Deficits in auditory processing, which impact phonological awareness (difficulty discriminating and blending sounds, as well as keeping the order of sounds in short term memory)




- Large font size

- Uncluttered page


